



Spring Camp Rules 2017

Children may not be left at camp unsupervised at any time. If your session takes you off site, you are required to make arrangements with another adult who will agree to be responsible for them until you return. Session instructors are NOT babysitters and will NOT assume responsibility for your children.

- Quiet enjoyment only 7:00 Am and after 11:00 PM each night.
- Black and grey water dump is available nearby, do not pour your grey water on the ground or in the bush, it attracts bears and we don't want you to be eaten.
- No shooting (not even archery, pellet or BB guns or slingshots) or fireworks permitted in the park.
- Do not disturb flowers, plants, rocks or fossils.
- Use receptacles for trash and recycling. No littering, but you already knew that!
- All vehicles should be parked facing out (not facing in), in case of emergency evacuation.
- You may be required to park in overflow parking.
- All cyclists 18 years and under must wear a helmet according to Alberta law. Adults are encouraged to wear one.

Alcohol Policy

Attendees should not be seen to be consuming alcohol away from their campsites. As well, your JFW code of conduct requires you to drink responsibly and never become publicly intoxicated.

The JFW responsible Pet Ownership code must be adhered to and will be posted on the registration page, as well as posted at camp.
